NICENE CREED**EXPLANATION**

We believe in one God	Three Persons – One God
The Father, the Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all that is seen and unseen.	1 st Person of the Trinity; Creator of ALL that which is known or unknown.
We believe in One Lord, Jesus Christ, the only SON of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from light, True God from True God, begotten not made, One in being with the Father. Through him all things were made.	2 nd Person of the Trinity; Son, Redeemer; this tells us his relationship to the 1 st Person; He is equal to the Father.
For us and OUR salvation He came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit he was born of the Virgin Mary and became Man.	The 2 nd Person of the Trinity took on humanity in the person of Jesus.
For OUR sake He was crucified under Pontius Pilate; He suffered, died, and was buried. On the third day He rose again in fulfillment of the scriptures; He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father.	Summarizes the Paschal (Easter) Mystery We recall this at Mass during the Memorial Acclamation. He rose from the dead, body, and soul; He returned to the Father as Jesus, 2 nd Person of the Trinity, human and divine.
He will come AGAIN in glory to JUDGE the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.	The Second Coming of Christ. The Final judgement at the end of time.
We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the Giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, with the Father and the Son He is worshipped and glorified. He has spoken through the prophets.	3 rd Person of the Trinity; Sanctifier; Relationship to the 1 st and 2 nd Persons of the Trinity; Equal with the Father and the Son; Source of inspiration for the scriptures.
We believe in one, holy, catholic, and apostolic Church.	United in Creed, Code and Worship. Holy because Jesus is holy. Universal, founded on the Apostles.
We acknowledge one Baptism for the forgiveness of sins.	Initiation into the Body of Christ.
We look for the Resurrection of the dead, and the Life of the world to come.	We will also rise from the dead, body and soul like Jesus. Eternal life – Heaven or Hell.
